- 7.5 **Legislative Update.** We expect Spring 2023 to include advocacy action for the School + State Finance Project bill on school funding.

## 7.6 LEARN Agency Update:

- The Richard Lounsbery Foundation. The Richard Lounsbery Foundation fully funded the National Coast Guard Museum Association/LEARN grant proposal at \$135,000.
- Magnet School Planning. Kate Ericson, Executive Director, and Dr. Ryan Donlon, Associate Executive Director, are facilitating conversations on strengths, weaknesses, threats, and opportunities that exist in our current magnet school context.
- RESC Alliance Special Education Contract. The RESC Alliance Special Education contract was received. This is a \$860,400 technical assistance contract through which LEARN will provide professional learning services.
- Igniting Change. A 3-year, equity-centered, professional learning plan with national experts and regional supports launched on October 19<sup>th</sup> with 352 participants.
- Audit Preparation. LEARN auditors will share their findings with the Executive Committee on November 17 and the full Board in December.
- Electric Vehicle Programming. Eversource and DEEP have approved 2 EV charging stations (each with 4 chargers) at LEARN owned sites: Hatchetts Hill, RMMS, and MSMHS.
- **Department of Public Health.** LEARN is supporting the Department of Public Health menstrual product project.
- CAPSS/CABE Convention. The conference is on Friday, November 18 & Saturday, November 19 at the Mystic Marriott Hotel, Groton.
- Martin Luther King Jr. Scholarship Dinner. Three LEARN students were awarded \$25,000 scholarships: one student from Three Rivers Middle College Magnet High School and two students from Marine Science Magnet High School. A LEARN administrative team attended the dinner.
- Alternative School Programming. Several area school districts are looking for
  alternative school opportunities for students. LEARN is exploring models that might
  be brought to the region. Administrators are heading to Washtenaw ISD in Ann
  Arbor, Michigan. There, leaders will visit an ESA that runs county-wide
  outplacement programs and alternative schools.
- **8. Goal Setting Meetings.** Kate Ericson, Bridgette Gordon-Hickey, and Dr. Ryan Donlon spent the month of October meeting with LEARN administrators to review goals and coherence plans for the year.
